## **IB** Implementation Update

PYP implementation and progress:

- Palliser Literacy Coach, Orishia Asher is also a veteran PYP teacher. She is meeting with Milo teachers once a month to provide support in literacy and IB implementation.
- Teachers in gr.1-6 are using PYP Inquiry Planner templates, practicing reflection and collaboration
- Teachers are focused on building inquiry skills in students, reflective skills and action plans after units of inquiry.
- Explore It has been focused on: Global Awareness, leadership committees (gr. 5-9) and grade 1-4 French
- Learners of the week were celebrated with certificates at the November assembly
- Updating IB Action Plan and requirements for submitting evidence for our accreditation in the fall of 2017
- Online training for teachers is in January/February.
- We are partnered with another IB School in Chestermere! Grades 1-4 now have penpals:)

#### Our current goals are:

- Include Now and Then of Units of Inquiry outside of classrooms
- Post and use key concepts and action plans - incorporate the Inquiry - Action Cycle
- Integrate student reflection and action plans at the end of a UoI (Unit of Inquiry)
- Develop student "agency" leadership and ownership for their learning
- Use the POI checklist to guide planning
- Showcase students through locker samples and Wonder students
- Develop learner goals weekly reflect and share
- Collect samples and resources for the Units of Inquiry
